Lake Clear Property Owners Association Survey March 2019 Complete Summary Results for LCPOA Membership

Purpose

 The LCPOA chose to survey its membership to ensure that members are being represented in the best way possible. The survey results will help us to get to know the membership better and will provide valuable feedback to the LCPOA regarding member priorities.

Methodology

- The survey was designed using the free tool Google Forms and members received a link to the survey via email.
- The survey was fully anonymous (i.e., no names, email or IP addresses associated with responses).
- Lake Clear currently has about 345 properties. Of those, 245 (71%) are paid members of the LCPOA. Eighteen members had no email address or the email address provided was no longer valid. In total, 227 members (93%) received surveys.
- While some properties had more than one email address, members were asked to choose only one person to respond per property.
- Summary data results were promised to the membership.

Response Rate and Representation

- There were 142 respondents out of 227 surveys sent out.
- This is a 63% response rate, which is very good.
 - "Internal surveys will generally receive a 30-40% response rate (or more) on average, compared to an average 10-15% response rate for external surveys." https://www.surveygizmo.com/resources/blog/survey-response-rates/
- We consulted with a professional statistician who was able to confirm the following:
 - The survey was in essence a census, and censuses are considered to be unbiased surveys. He could not find any inherent bias in our survey.
 - o A 63% response rate indicates a good representation of the membership.
 - In fact the survey should be considered a good representation of the ownership, as well, because of the high membership rate in the association.

Cautions and Limitations

- Not all respondents answered all questions (Number of responses is indicated for each question).
- While comments catch our attention, one has to remember that unless multiple respondents make the point, statistically it does not hold a lot of weight.

Of Note:


- 56% of respondents, or their families, have owned their property for more than 30 years.
- 57% of respondents are on private roads.
- While only 13% of respondents are year round residents, 22% indicate having a year round house on their property. 12% indicate they are at the lake for more than 5 months of the year. Winterized cottages are owned by 23% of respondents.
- 12% of respondents do not know if a fire truck can reach them.
- 91% of respondents indicated they have a septic system. 65% said they would or might be willing to take part in a septic inspection program.
- While 73% of respondents felt their MPAC property assessments were fair, 68% felt they
 were not getting value for the taxes they paid.
- 67% of respondents have at least one family member who fishes in spring, summer and fall.
- 77% of respondents are concerned with water quality.
- 73% of respondents are concerned with septic systems and other waste disposal systems.
- 62% of respondents are concerned about the removal of shoreline vegetation.
- 53% of respondents are concerned with the use of recreational vehicles as cottages on the lake.
- 40% of respondents have been LCPOA members for over 20 years.
- 79% or respondents said that at least one family member accesses www.lakeclear.org.
- Only 33% of respondents were aware of the closed Facebook group, For Everything Lake Clear.
- 97% of respondents receive eUpdates.
- 32% of respondents indicated they might or would be willing to sit on an LCPOA committee.






How much lake frontage do you own?




How much lake frontage do you lease?




Approximately how many days per year do you spend at the lake?




Is your lake property on a private road?




If yes, can a firetruck reach the buildings on your property?




Do you have a well?




Where do you get your drinking water?




How do you deal with your waste water?


Would you be willing to participate in a septic assessment program?








Do you have cell service on your property?




If yes, who is your provider?


If you are not satisfied with your cell service at the lake, please tell us why not.

53 respondents commented that they had no, low, or sporadic signals or phones that worked only in specific locations on the property. One responded indicated price was a factor.


Do you subscribe to an Internet Service (other than your cell phone data) at the lake?




If yes, who is your provider?

If you are not satisfied with your Internet service at the lake, please tell us why not.




- 33 respondents commented that their Internet is slow, sporadic and/or unreliable.
- 4 respondents complained about the quality of customer service.
- 3 complained about the high cost.
- 3 respondents said there were no affordable options for reliable high speed internet.
- 1 respondent indicated that while their Internet was reliable, the data caps and speed are not adequate.

"This is the biggest issue we face. We would be able to spend more time at the cottage, if the Internet were much better."

Taxes and Township


What is the current MPAC assessment value of your property?






Do you feel this is a fair assessment?

44 respondents said they believe they receive good value for the services provided.

Of those who provided comments, 4 said it is because of good snow removal, three spoke to loving the lake, 2 said good road maintenance, 2 said we get what we pay for/deserve, and 2 commented on the responsive staff and problems being dealt with adequately.

If no, why not?


79 responses

98 respondents said they do NOT believe they receive good value. Of those who provided comments, 34 said they received no or few services, 24 commented on high taxes, 20 commented on having to take garbage to the dump and 9 commented that there is charge for garbage. 12 said there is little or no support for their road or roads around the lake, 7 commented on lack of sewage treatment, and 7 on lack of town water. 2 respondents are concerned about ongoing speeding around the lake and 3 respondents feel the township does not protect the health of the lake.

"We pay about the same taxes as in Ottawa with many fewer services."

"BVT, to whom we pay extremely high taxes, have done almost nothing to protect the health of the lake."

37 responses

11respondents they would like to give the new councillor more time before passing judgment.

10 respondents indicated they had no issues.

2 respondents feel the local councillor listens them to.

2 respondents said they felt our councillor understands our issues and does not set unrealistic goals, and council does what they can.

6 respondents indicated they really didn't know and wished that had been one of the options.

"Our municipal councillor is serving to represent our interests."

If no, why not?


38 responses

10 respondents indicated that the councillor was new and should have time to prove himself. 6 feel that our councillor has no knowledge of and/or support for lake issues, 4 feel he doesn't take lake residents seriously, nor value them, and 4 feel taxes are too high. 5 referred to the lack of regulation re RVs and other lake development and environmentl issues. 2 see little that has been done, 2 feel too many items are deffered and 2 feel the councillor should be a Lake Clear resident. 1 person indicated they wanted to keep the ward system, while another indicated the ward system should be ended.

"We are a large portion of the BVT tax base, yet are treated as irritants and entitled."

"We have a strong sense that cottage owners are treated as a source of revenue rather that as community members deserving of services."




Do you or someone in your family fish in Lake Clear?


Are you concerned about the water quality of Lake Clear?




Are you concerned about septic systems and other waste water disposal systems around the lake?




Are you concerned with the removal of shoreline vegetation around the lake?




Are you concerned about the use of recreational vehicles as cottages around the lake?



How long have you been a member of the LCPOA?




Have you ever attended the LCPOA AGM?




Do you plan to attend a LCPOA AGM in the future?




Are you aware of our website www.lakeclear.org?




Do you or any of your family members access www.lakeclear.org?

Do you have any suggestions to make our website better? 18 responses


Of the 18 people that commented on this question, 9 expressed their compliments and gratitude for the site and offered no suggestions for improvement. Suggestions included creating a buy and sell for cottagers, including a cottage rental directory, and adding information about scuba diving, as well as information about water quality and quantity issues in Renfrew County. One respondent suggesting highlighting the website more often on the Facebook page and in Updates. One respondent suggested working closely with the LCC.

One respondent felt the site needed to be updated more frequently and membership fees should be able to be paid online.






Have you or any of your family members joined the LCPOA Facebook group?


The LCPOA provides many services and addresses common issues on behalf of the membership. Please indicate by checking below all that you would like to see continued.
